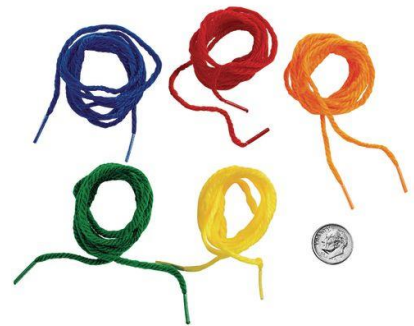


String Painting

1. Prepare small cups of paint.
 - a. You don't need a lot of paint in each cup. Just enough to wet the pieces of yarn with paint later.
 - b. You can also use the pots of a paint palette.



2. Cut as many pieces of yarn that you would like (each piece will be one flower).
 - a. You don't want them to be too small or too long. Keep the size of your paper in mind.
 - b. You will be curling these up on the paper and you will need some string left over so that you can tape it to the table to pull the paper/canvas up at the end.

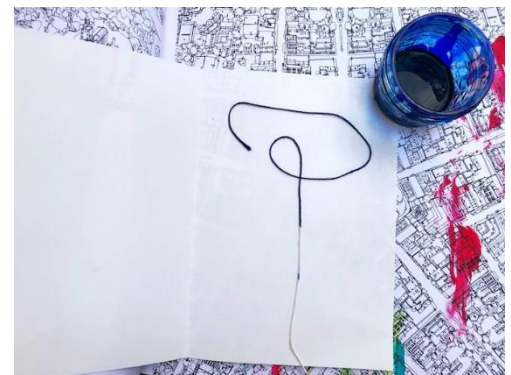


3. Paint the entire paper or canvas with any color you would like.
 - a. Make it a thicker coat of paint, but not so much that it is falling over the edges.
 - b. Place project on newspaper or tarp on top of the table you are using.

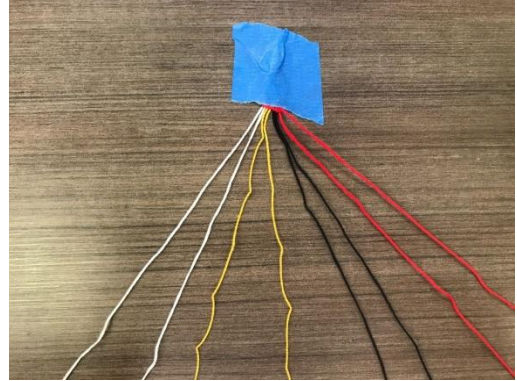
4. Place pieces of yarn in the paint cups that you would like.
 - a. Only put about $\frac{1}{2}$ to $\frac{3}{4}$ of the string in the paint.



5. Place each piece of paint covered yarn on the paper or canvas, starting toward the top and making swirls/loops where you want!



6. Tape ends of string to the table that you are using.



7. Slowly pull paper or canvas up and away from the table.
 - a. The strings will make their way down the canvas as you pull up, leaving the flowers!!
